## GRACE C. SCOTT



Second Lieutenant Grace C. Scott was a military nurse stationed at Tuskegee Army Air Field (TAAF), located in Tuskegee, Alabama. She was one of the five nurses left at Tuskegee Army Air Field (TAAF) in 1946 before its closing. She was originally from Cambridge, Massachusetts and was a graduate of Cambridge City Hospital.

A fellow nurse shared with Ms. Pia Winters Jordan, author of *Memories of a Tuskegee Airmen Nurse and Her Military Sisters*, that 2LT Scott (also known as Scotty) used to entertain other nurses with her piano playing. It was mentioned in a news article from Lockbourne Army Air Base (LAAB), located in Columbus, Ohio, that she reported from TAAF to LAAB in July 1946 or shortly thereafter. It is believed she first tried to be recruited into the Navy Nurse Corps, writing a letter to the Secretary of the Navy in 1943, but Black Nurses were not allowed in the Navy Nurse Corps (NNC) until 1945.
